



WHO IS PERSPECTIVES?

Perspectives, Inc. is an award-winning nonprofit located in St. Louis Park, MN. For over 40 years we have developed and implemented programs that provide opportunity, advancement, healing, and hope to thousands of mothers struggling with the traumas associated with homelessness, addiction and mental illness. We believe we are one of the most unique and holistic programs in the nation, as we serve both the mother and child through a trauma-informed integrated model, thereby facilitating their return to social and economic mainstream.

HOW DO WE DO IT?

With a host of programs to address all the issues that bring a mother and her children to our doors. We begin with *supportive housing*: 53 fully furnished apartments, located in a residential neighborhood that is adjacent to a park, with paved walkways, playgrounds and gardens. When a mother enters our program, she is reunited with her children in a secure home so she can safely begin to address the issues that first brought her to us. Our case managers, facilities staff and program liaisons immediately come together to create a custom roadmap that includes on-site chemical and mental health counselors, employment counselors, healthy life-skills, and a comprehensive, year-round program for the children.

Our *clinical services* offer diagnostic assessments, treatment planning, screening, referrals and individual/group/family therapy for women and children

who have experienced complex trauma including emotional abuse, severe neglect, and sexual and/or physical abuse.

Sadly, the children often become the collateral damage of their mother's poor choices. The combination of trauma and lack of a consistent home dramatically impacts a child's development as well as their academic progress. Our *Kids Connection* is an afterschool academic enrichment program staffed by licensed teachers to help our students advance socially and academically. This program is a referral source to our *Children's Mental Health Services*.

Kids Cafe, a component of our out-of-school children's enrichment program, provides nutritional meals, education and culinary skills each night under the guidance of a nutritionist and teaching chef.

WHAT ARE THE OUTCOMES?

The numbers are impressive: 75% of the mothers and children will graduate from our program and move into permanent housing. Eighty-two percent of the students will maintain or improve their academic performance. However, there are other outcomes that are impossible to put into a database - restored dignity for the mothers, a safe home for a child, free from violence and addiction. And a renewal of hope and dreams for a life of possibilities. We have shown for decades that a high-touch, integrated, client-centered approach utilizes that trauma-informed care empower mothers can and rebuild families.
